## What are the 3 most important aspects of Newton's Climate Action Plan? (100-200 words)

- 1. The focus on retrofitting existing buildings. To meet our climate goals, existing buildings which represent the majority of Newton's emissions must be retrofit to be carbon-neutral.
- 2. Focus on ensuring that existing retrofits are satisfactory. Negative publicity and experiences with retrofits can be extremely detrimental to meeting our goals.
- 3. Automating reporting for smaller buildings. It just doesn't seem feasible to require small landlords and homeowners to compile this information on their own.

## What are 3 items you would like to see prioritized in the update to the CAP? (100-200 words)

- 1. We must extend BERDO to smaller buildings in Newton, and not just leave it at the largest buildings as it does now.
- 2. A continued focus on retrofits of existing buildings and making sure those who install things like heat pumps have a positive experience.
- 3. Start looking harder at resilience projects. It's becoming clearer that regardless that as hard as we work in Newton, the country and world as a whole are going to miss the targets we've set, so how can we ensure we in Newton are prepared for our warmer future?

## What other ideas, plans, or proposals do you have that will support Newton's Climate Action Plan? (100-200 words)

I'd like to see more publicity and action around successful projects. I've spoken with people who are unaware of the climate aspects of the new Countryside school. And the fact that Northland (and potentially Riverside) is going to be full Passive House is probably underappreciated. Can we organize tours or listening sessions to publicize this better?
